

Total Economic Impact Since 1998

The state's 30 designated Main Street Maryland communities are managed by local government and nonprofit partnerships that are committed to working day in day out to transform communities, celebrate historic character, and revitalize local economies across Maryland. Collectively, these Main Streets have initiated operating and capital projects to support the nearly 5,500 small businesses within their commercial districts.
